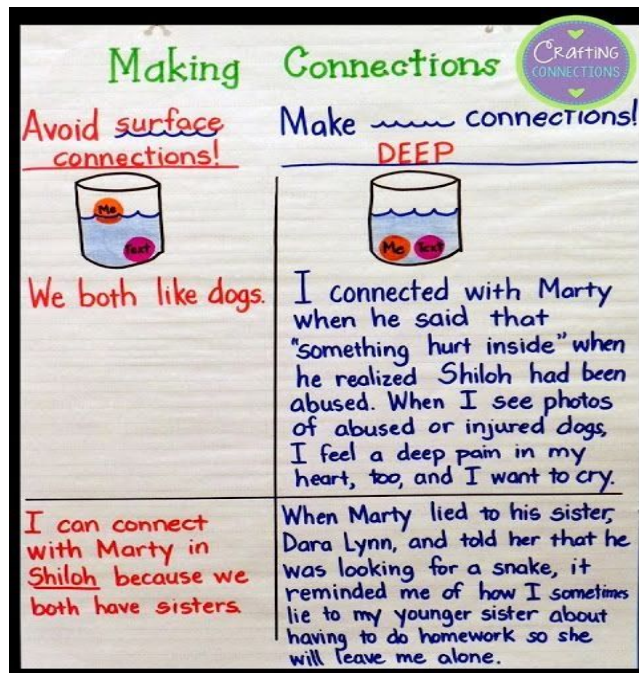
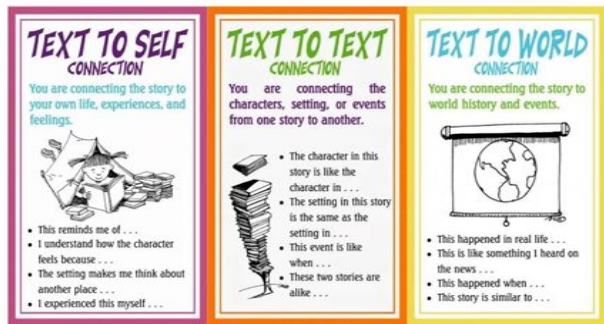

Making connections

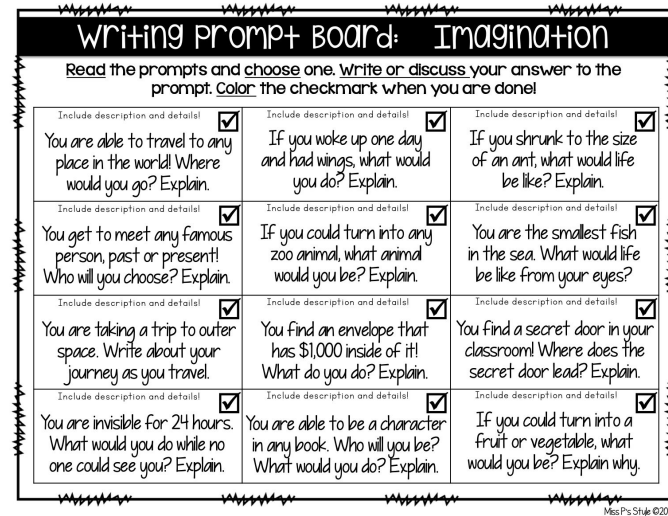
- Go to the website [Kids News](#)
- Select an article that is of interest to you (a different article should be read each day)
- Read the article and record any connections that you made to the text in your Reader's Notebook



Narrative prompts

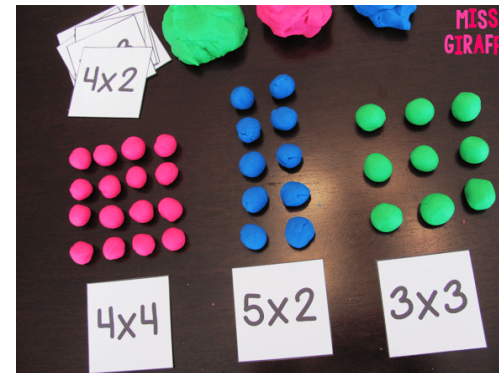
- Pick a prompt from the picture below (zoom in your screen to read choices)
- Plan your story idea
- Write your story
- Revise and edit your story
- Publish and share!

This might take you a few days to do. Spend the first day planning, the next day writing and editing/revising and the last day publishing. Read your writing out aloud to mum or dad and ask them for feedback.



Times tables activities

- Make arrays using different objects eg. lego, bark, leaves, spoons, toys, teddies, books etc. Write the matching multiplication and repeated addition equations. E.g. $4 \times 4 = 4+4+4+4$



- Go to [multiplication fact tables](#)
- Choose 3 sets of timetables, practise then ask a family member to test you, or test yourself!
- Draw multiplication flowers
