


SPECIALIST ACTIVITIES – Year Three to Six

	<p>(Fairy Liquid is best)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> · 1-2 table spoons of glycerin (glycerin makes the bubbles thick and last) <p>You can find glycerin in the baking session of your supermarket</p> <p>Make this basic bubble mixture.
