



What is a BYOD?




BYOD stands for **Bring Your Own Device** and is an initiative that enables students to utilise devices in an educational settings. The program fosters a unique and interactive learning environment, introducing innovative concepts and accelerated development.

The BYOD program is a parent-owned device supporting students to use the device at home and at school.

Why a BYOD?

There has been research from the Department of Education that has shown that students who own a device are:

- more motivated and engaged in their learning
- better organised
- achieve improved learning outcomes
- able to collaborate better
- able to think analytically

Students can bring an alternative device that meets the following required specifications:

- Lenovo brand
- CPU Processor N100- 4 cores up to 3.4Ghz
- 8 gigs of RAM
- Minimum 12.2 inch screen size / Maximum size 13 inch screen size
- Windows 11
- Minimum 6 hours battery life
- 128 GB Hard Drive
- Peripherals e.g. carry case, stylus

Highly recommended device features:

- Screen protection
- Personal insurance for loss
- Up-to-date antivirus and security software
- Ports, e.g. microSD card, USB-A, USB-C, a 3.5mm headphone jacks



Teaching with BYOD devices

Teaching @ Lyndhurst is structured in a way that incorporates BYOD devices into a natural flow within the classroom.

As teachers we prioritise and encourage

- Opportunities for students to use devices daily, integrated within the classroom whether that be in numeracy, literacy or other content areas.
- The opportunity to connect with schoolwork at home via Google Classroom that enables parents to have quality learning conversations with their children.
- We encourage parents to have an active participation in setting up expectations with your child as to how they are to use devices something we will also focus on at the beginning of next year.

Students also attend dedicated weekly Technology sessions that focus on

- Cyber safety and becoming upstanding digital citizens
- ICT skills
- Troubleshooting technical issues



What to do next for LWT devices:

- Order a LWT device: Lyndhurst PS BYOD Portal https://lyndhurstps.orderportal.com.au OR use the QR Code
- Access the 2024/2025 Digital Technologies

 Acceptable Use Agreement via the school website.

 Sign the electronic agreement via Compass.
- Organise for the device to be included to your contents insurance or take out a separate policy to cover for loss.
- Devices will be delivered to the school in January 2025 for customisation and will be given to students in February 2025.





What to do next for non LWT devices:

- Purchase from your preferred store/retailer (please make sure the device meets the minimum requirements)
- Access the 2024/2025 Digital Technologies Acceptable Use Agreement (available soon) via the school website. Sign the electronic agreement via Compass.
- Organise for the device to be included to your contents insurance or take out a separate policy to cover for loss.
- Take your device to the office during the first week of Term 1. Devices will be customised (provided they meet the minimum specifications) or will be given access to the school's network, and given to students late February/early March.
